Applicant Admissions Information

Fall 2009

The Physical Therapist Assistant (PTA) program at Guilford Technical Community College is a Piedmont Regional educational program offered in cooperation with Davidson County Community College, Forsyth Technical Community College, Randolph Community College, and Rockingham Community College. The four semesters of PTA academic coursework, beginning Fall 2009, are taken at GTCC's Jamestown campus. The degree is awarded by GTCC. Resources, such as clinical facilities and faculty, as well as approval standards, limit the number of applicants accepted into the program. Acceptance into the PTA Program is competitive: a total of 24 individuals are admitted to the program each year with limited number of slots assigned to the five participating colleges. All applicants must meet minimum requirements and specific deadlines. ***However, meeting minimum requirements does not guarantee admission. Students not admitted to the program who wish to be considered for the following year must re-apply.***

The deadline to apply to the PTA program for the 2009 fall semester is May 29, 2009.

Phase I Minimum Admissions Requirements (MAR)

To be considered for admission to the program, all applicants **must** meet the minimum requirements by May 29, 2009. ***Meeting the minimum requirements does not guarantee admission.***

1. **Completed Admissions File:** Current admissions application, official high school or GED transcripts and college transcripts (these will be reviewed for possible transfer credit).

2. **Placement Test Scores**

College English with a grade of "C" or higher may waive some of the tests. Applicants not meeting these minimum scores should enroll in the appropriate developmental courses (as directed by an academic advisor).

3. **General Education Requirements**

All of the following General Education **courses must be completed** with a grade of "C" or higher by **May 29, 2009** to be considered for admission into the fall 2009 PTA class:

4. **Volunteer/Observation Hours**

Applicants are required to complete twenty (20) volunteer/observation hours in a physical therapy setting with a licensed Physical Therapist and/or Physical Therapist Assistant. The required observation hours form is included in this packet (page 5) and must be submitted to an Admissions Advisor at the time of the MAR review.

5. **Complete Minimum Admissions Requirements (MAR) Review:**

Applicants must meet with an Admissions Advisor to complete the Minimum Admission Requirements (MAR) Review in order to be considered for the program. This step must be completed by May 29, 2009. ***This meeting is required. No appointment is necessary.*** Enrollment Services is open 8:00 a.m. to 6:30 p.m. Monday through Thursday; 9:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. on Fridays. Hours are subject to change during the summer. ***Please visit the GTCC website for any changes.***

Phase II Ranking Review

When all minimum requirements are met, applicants are ranked using a point system. As this is a limited enrollment program, it is in the student's best interest to achieve as many ranking points as possible. ***A minimum overall score of 48 is required in order to be eligible for the first selection process.*** Students who meet the minimum requirements but are not qualified for the first selection process (minimum score of 48) will be eligible for a second selection process, if needed. All students participating in a second selection process will be ranked according to points and not by school of origin.

The components of the ranking system include the following items:

1. Grade Points for General Education Courses

For BIO 165 & 166:	A = 12 points	B = 8 points	C = 4 points
For all other classes:	A = 6 points	B = 4 points	C = 2 points

*Students who complete BIO 166 and/or ENG 114 (or ENG 112) with a grade of “C” or higher by May 29, 2009 will receive points for grades earned during the ranking review. Even though these courses are not part of the minimum requirements, they are required to **graduate** from the PTA program. It is **highly recommended** that the courses be taken **before** starting the PTA program; otherwise they must be taken while in the PTA program.

**Students who complete PSY 241 with a grade of “C” or higher by May 29, 2009 will also receive points for this course grade during the ranking review. Although PSY 241 is not part of the minimum requirements and is not required to graduate from the PTA program, it can be taken to increase an applicant’s points.

2. Related Experience

Points are awarded as listed below. Applicants must complete the Related Experience Form in this packet (page 6). This documentation must be received in the Enrollment Services Office by May 29, 2009.

10 points	Completion of an associates’ or bachelors’ degree in an <i>Allied Health related field.</i>
7 points	Completion of a diploma or certificate in an <i>Allied Health related field.</i>
5 points	100 hours of work experience as a physical therapy technician/aide or 100 volunteer hours in a physical therapy setting with a licensed Physical Therapist and/or Physical Therapist Assistant. The 20 hours of mandatory experience for minimum requirements may be used to count towards the 100 hours.
3 points	Completion of a College Tech Prep course of study in a Health Careers Pathway at the high school level within the past 3 years.

Adding together the grade points and related experience determines your total score. The twenty-four students with the highest points will be admitted to the PTA program. In the case of applicants with the same rank, the academic point total will be used as the tie-breaker.

Notification Procedure

Letters will be mailed to applicants who have *met and completed* a Minimum Admission Requirements (MAR) Review. If you were not accepted or declined your admission, you must re-apply and complete another MAR review if you wish to be considered for the next year's class.

Tuition, Fees and Expenses

Tuition is \$42.00 per credit hour for in-state students and \$233.30 per credit hour for out-of-state students. Additional student fees include books, parking, student activities, student publications, lab fees, malpractice insurance, and health/accident insurance. Students should also plan for travel expenses to-from the GTCC Jamestown Campus as well as travel for clinical education courses. *Tuition is subject to change.*

1. Financial Aid

GTCC tries to assure that no qualified student is denied a college education simply due to lack of financial resources. 2. Clinical Education Expenses

Students must have transportation to and from the different clinical facilities and may be required to arrange temporary living arrangements during clinical education courses. The majority of the clinical sites are located within the participating colleges' service area; however, availability of local clinical sites cannot be guaranteed.

Accreditation

The Physical Therapist Assistant program has received full accreditation from the Commission on Accreditation in Physical Therapy Education (CAPTE) of the American Physical Therapy Association.

Drug Testing and Criminal Background Checks

Students admitted to the PTA program participate in clinical education in various clinical facilities. Clinical facilities may include drug testing and criminal background investigation prior to the start of a clinical education course. If a clinical facility refuses to accept a student due to a failed drug test or criminal background investigation, the student will not be allowed to continue in the course or the PTA program.

Slot Allotments for 2009-2010

Each member school will be designated a specific number of slots allowed per year for admission consideration, *on the condition that applicants from the school have at least 48 points*. Based on an initial maximum enrollment of twenty four students per year, the following slots have been identified:
