From Greensboro: Go North on Hwy 220 to Hwy 158. Then go East on Hwy 158 for 1.5 miles to the Shane's Sporting Clays sign on right. Turn right onto gravel drive and follow signs, one mile to club.

Shane's is a family owned Sporting Clays range in Summerfield, North Carolina. Since opening in 1987, the facility has since grown to a 14-station course with a wobble area and two sections dedicated to practice traps for beginners. Shane's was the first Sporting Clays range in the state of North Carolina and has the tallest trap tower at 115 feet.
