The Emergency Medical Science program has a selective admissions process. The cap on annual student enrollment is 25. Therefore, with each admission process, the number of accepted students varies depending on the number of continuing students. Typically, 25 students are accepted with each fall admission. This packet will outline minimum criteria, program coursework, and the application/selection process. Before applying, it is recommended to review the <u>Technical Standards and Essential Functions</u> required for the program. Reading these standards carefully along with a realistic assessment of your own personality, interests, abilities, strengths, and weaknesses will ensure that you choose a program and career path that is a good fit for you.

Please read the contents of this packet carefully and in its entirety as some requirements are time-sensitive.

PROGRAM ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

✓ Complete the GTCC General Admission/Readmission Process (new and returning students).

- Students currently enrolled at GTCC do not need to complete a new application for admission. These students will begin with the remaining steps and make sure the NC Residency is current.

LIMITED ENTRY ADMISSION PROCESS – GTCC HEALTH SCIENCES PROGRAMS MEET PROGRAM ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Complete the GTCC General Admission Process (New and Returning Students)

- New and returning GTCC students must complete the GTCC general admission, including the North Carolina Residency Determination Service (RDS). To get started, visit <u>https://www.gtcc.edu/admissions-and-aid/apply-now.php</u>
 - **Returning students=** students previously admitted to GTCC and have not been enrolled in courses for more than 12 months
- Submit your official transcripts to the GTCC Admissions Office by email at transcripts@gtcc.edu. Once received, transcripts are evaluated by GTCC's Admissions staff. Approved transfer credits will be added to your academic record as appropriate. (*Note: it is the responsibility of the applicant to ensure that all official transcripts have been received by GTCC's Admissions Department. Please visit <u>https://transcripts.gtcc.edu/</u> to verify that your transcripts have been received.)*
 - Please allow a minimum of TWO WEEKS for evaluation to occur. This process takes longer near the beginning or end of a semester. Transfer credits from regionally-accredited colleges/universities <u>must</u> appear on your GTCC Student Planning transcript in order to be considered for meeting program requirements and/or earning ranking points.
- Activate your GTCC Titan Account. You should be able to do this within 48 hours of completing your GTCC Application.

Complete the Required Program Information Session by 5pm, July 5th

Information Sessions completed for previous application cycles are <u>not</u> acceptable for purposes of meeting this requirement!

This session will provide you with a detailed overview of the program, faculty and student expectations, class schedules and clinical requirements, the minimum program admission requirements, submitting your program application, and the selection and notification process for the incoming class.

- You must have an activated Titan account to access the information session.
- Enroll yourself in the Limited Entry Health Programs Information Sessions Canvas course and go to the Home page to complete the Fall 2024 Emergency Medical Science module (Do Not Go To Assignments).
- You must pass all three modules with a score of 100% to receive credit for completing this task and to access the program application. <u>Access to the module will close at 5pm on July 5th!</u>

Demonstrate College Readiness for English AND Mathematics

Complete the following PREREQUISITE general education courses with a grade of "C" or higher or successfully pass the CASAS exam for Math and English, which can be scheduled through the GTCC Assessment Center office.

Pre-Requisite Courses to enter this program:

- **D** English 111- Writing & Inquiry (or a higher-level course)
- **Math 143- Quantitative Literacy (***or a higher-level course***)**

or

Complete the CASAS exam and obtain a minimum score of 254 reading comprehension goal and/or a minimum score of 249 math goal.

SUBMITTING YOUR PROGRAM APPLICATION

Program Applications will be accepted March 4, 2024, through 5pm on July 12, 2024.

- Once you have completed all of the program admission requirements, it's time to submit your program application. This will be completed electronically via the *Limited Entry Health Programs Information Sessions* course in Canvas
 - Application submissions will be accepted beginning Monday, March 4, 2024.
 - Only one submission will be permitted for each applicant.
- If applicable, you will upload documentation of other ranking criteria.
- It is critical that you check your transcript in **Student Planning** to make sure all coursework is accounted for, including transfer credits. Ranking points will only be given for courses that are on record. It is your responsibility to ensure all official transcripts have been submitted to Admissions and processed for transfer credits.
- Incomplete and/or ineligible applications will not be moved forward to the selection committee.
- Applications will not be reviewed by the Limited Entry Programs Office until after the July 12th deadline. It is important to make sure all requirements are met BEFORE submitting your application.

PROGRAM APPLICANT SELECTION AND NOTIFICATION PROCESS

Ranking and Selection Process

One to two weeks following the July 12th deadline, all application submissions will be screened by the Limited Entry Programs Office to confirm all criteria have been met. All applicants will be notified via GTCC email if their submission will be moved forward to the Selection Committee for the final ranking review.

The next 2-3 weeks following the initial screening, the Selection Review Committee (comprised of Emergency Medical Science Program Director and faculty, Dean of Human Services & Public Safety, and Limited Entry Programs Office Staff) will review all eligible applications.

Applicants are ranked using a points system and will be selected based on the total points earned (see below). Ties will be decided based on the following criteria: 1) The total points earned in the "General Education Courses" ranking section; 2) The GPA of the last school attended; and 3) The date of the Limited Entry Program Application for the program of interest.

Notification Process

Final results will be sent electronically to the applicant's GTCC email address **approximately** 4 weeks after the application deadline – it is the applicant's responsibility to check this email account frequently to avoid missing important communications from GTCC.

- Applicants offered a seat must accept or decline a program position by submitting an Intent to Enroll Form within 5 calendar days of the date on the acceptance letter. Failure to respond within the stated timeframe will result in the position being offered to an alternate. Once a student declines a program position, the decision may not be reversed.
- Applicants have 7 business days from the date on the notification letter to contest the results of the selection process. The request for review of the results must be submitted in writing to the Interim Dean of Human Services, (Dr. Jeremy Bennett jdbennett5@gtcc.edu). The Dean will render a decision within 7-10 business days of receipt of the written request. The Dean's decision is final.

PROGRAM ORIENTATION, ADVISING/REGISTRATION, AND ENROLLMENT

Once a student accepts a position in the EMS program, all communication will be directed to the EMS Program Director regarding matters related to the EMS program, advising/registration, and enrollment.

The student must attend all program orientations, meetings, or other events scheduled before classes start. Failure to attend these meetings without prior approval from the EMS Program Director will result in removal from the EMS program; an alternate student will be selected to fill the vacant position, as directed by the Program Director.

The student must enroll in program classes prior to the first day of the semester. Failure to enroll without prior approval of the Program Director will result in removal from the health program.

A student who enrolls in first-semester classes for the program and withdraws from the program or is dropped from the program that semester must complete the entire program admission process if he/she wishes to apply for a future program entry.

The GTCC Health Sciences Limited Entry Process is not to be regarded as a contract between GTCC and students. GTCC reserves the right to change any provisions or requirements with adequate notice and minimum disruption to students.

Important Notes to Health Science Program Applicants

Program faculty reserve the right to revise or change course requirements in accordance with applicable state laws, college requirements, accreditation standards, and/or at the discretion of the faculty. By accepting admission into the program, the students agrees to at all times abide by the program requirements and procedures as set forth in the GTCC and EMS Program Student Handbook and the respective course syllabus issued at the beginning of each term for each course. The student is bound by such requirements and procedures regardless of whether they were established before or after the date of enrollment in the program. Changes made after the Handbook's publication will be posted as an addendum.

The EMS program requires all students to have a criminal background check, a drug screen, and submission of all required vaccinations prior to attending clinical and field internships. Healthcare agencies that are utilized for clinical and/or internship experiences require these evaluations. If a student is denied agency access due to a positive check or screening, the student will not be able to complete the clinical education experiences, which will result in the inability to continue in the EMS program. Screening may also be required after graduation by examination boards, state licensing boards, and employing agencies. Pending the outcome, a graduate may be disqualified from examination eligibility, state licensure, and/or employment.

Students must achieve a GPA of 3.0 or better to graduate. Students who receive a grade of "D" in a general education course (other than BIO) can graduate if their GPA is at least 3.0. However, a grade of "D" in a general education course will not transfer to another institution, nor will GTCC accept a grade of "D" for credit from another institution. Students must achieve a "C" or better in BIO and a "B" or better in all EMS program major courses. Students who do not achieve a "B" or better in these courses will be removed from the EMS program.

Students must achieve a GPA of 2.0 or better to graduate. Students who receive a grade of "D" in a general education course (other than BIO or CHM) can graduate if their GPA is at least 2.0. However, a grade of "D" in a general education course will not transfer to another institution, nor will GTCC accept a grade of "D" for credit from another institution. Students must achieve a "C" or better in BIO, CHM, and program major courses. Students who do not achieve a "C" or better in these courses will be suspended from the program.

Guilford Technical Community College's EMS Program in Jamestown, NC is accredited by the Commission on Accreditation of Allied Health Education Programs (CAAHEP) upon recommendation of the Committee on Accreditation for the EMS Professions (CoAEMSP).
