WHAT TO DO

CONTACT LAW ENFORCEMENT

If it is an emergency, call 911 for protection and to initiate a criminal investigation.

SEEK MEDICAL ATTENTION

If you have experienced physical or sexual violence, go to a hospital for evidence collection, treatment of injuries, and medication for sexually transmitted infections and pregnancy prevention. Forensic exams can be obtained for up to five days after an assault.

REPORT TO THE COLLEGE

Reporting to the college provides you with the option of addressing the incident under the college's Sexual Harassment, Sexual Violence, and Anti-Harassment Policy. It also allows the college to provide any available interim protective measures, academic accommodations, or changes to class or work schedules. Students, faculty, and staff may report incidents to any trusted faculty or staff member. Managers, supervisors, faculty, staff, and any other agent of the college are required to respond promptly and appropriately to allegations of sexual harassment and violence that are brought to their attention.

Regardless of when the incident occurred, you are encouraged to report the incident.
